

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Supported Internship?

A supported internship is a more structured type of study programme where you mainly learn in the workplace, gaining on the job training while still attending college to learn other essential skills.

What does an internship offer?

- The chance to learn new skills, specifically skills that employers are looking for
- The chance to become more independent and confident
- The chance to try different jobs roles in the workplace with the help of a Job Coach
- Support at the end of the internship to try and secure paid employment

How does an Internship work?

- You will be enrolled at a college or school and attend 1 or 2 days a week learning essential life and job skills
- 3 or 4 days of the week you will be in a work placement, learning on the job
- The internship runs in line with the academic year, from September to July

Will I be paid?

The internship is unpaid as you are still classed as being in Education - the aim is to upskill you and improve your chances of getting paid work at the end of the Internship.

Who can apply?

You can apply for an internship if:

- You have special educational needs & an open Educational Health & Care Plan (EHCP) in place
- You are 16 to 24 years old (minimum age 18 for Hospital placements)
- Most importantly you are motivated to work

Where are the Internships based?


We have a wide variety of placements in and around Reading, Maidenhead, Wokingham, Winnersh and High Wycombe. We have large host employers like Royal Berkshire Hospital (RBH) and Sodexo at Johnson and Johnson sites, as well as smaller employers like SEN schools and drama placement with Make/Sense Theatre.
