Head teacher's message

I mentioned in the newsletter last week and in a letter to parents earlier this week, that the National Education Union (NEU) has announced that its teacher members will be taking industrial action over the next couple of months. The NEU teaching union is pressing the government to commit to a fully funded pay increase for their members and are formally in a dispute over pay and conditions. The recent pay increase for teachers had to come out of existing budgets. The NEU is also committed to secure good working conditions for all staff and a better education for all children and young people.

If you don't have the dates proposed for strike action, the NEU strike dates affecting Reading schools are:

Wednesday 1 February
Thursday 2 March
Wednesday 15 March
Thursday 16 March

We have some teachers who are planning to strike and have staff who have children at schools that will be closed or partially open. The picture is ever evolving and I anticipate that we will have to close some classes. I will be in touch, offering as much notice as possible, to inform you of any classes that will be closed.

I understand that this will cause a number of you a number of difficulties and thank you for your understanding. Best wishes, Symon.

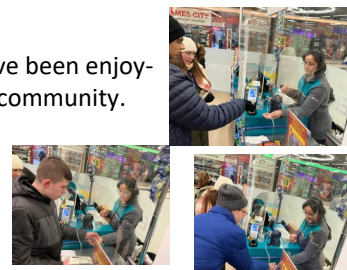
The Butterfly Community Café

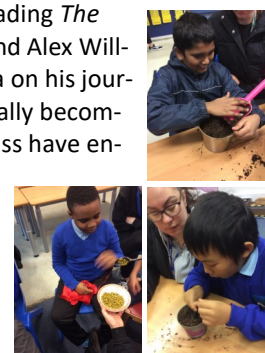
6th Form
