


Following an in-depth staff training programme, every class took part in the festival and over six days, a total of 127 students took part in sessions!


































5A



We also listened to the sensory story Boris the Bumblebee and The Little Seed.





































Hi, Class 2A have begun taking yoga lessons on a Friday with Kelly S. The children have done really well and are able to copy
