During a free flow session, the students in Wren Class choose the activities that they would like to explore.












Swan Class








Goldcrest Class

Students were in charge of all the different aspects to create a film: developing ideas, characters, planning scenes and creating the story board.

Our story starts when Elliot (Sam), a young boy from Reading who discovers an old book during his holidays in Barcelona. He brings the book back to the UK and shares the news with his friends. Students must follow the clues to solve the mystery of who is buried in The Abbey Ruins, but teachers will try to get first into Abbey.

Music workshops with Berkshire Maestros and The Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

During this term, Barn Owl, Starling and Merlin Class enjoyed 4 fantastic workshops with Berkshire Maestros and The Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. During this project, pupils devised original pieces of music and song based on Aaron Copland's Hoe Down. Following this in-school project, 11 students from The Avenue School were invited to reprise their performance at the Royal Albert Hall on the 11th of March.













Kingfisher Class

This term, Kingfisher Class had been learning about Changes. We have been having lots of fun investigating physical changes during sensory play and getting messy! We have explored changes in colour when mixing paint together, what happens to the texture of porridge oats and spaghetti when we cook themand what shapes we can make with playdough.

We took part in the sensory story Jasper's Beanstalk, where we experienced planting a seed and exploring what happened to the seed over time. As we recapped on this story, some of the students told us what props we need in order to plant the seeds. As part of the topic, we went on a school trip to the Lookout Discovery Centre in Bracknell which we all thoroughly enjoyed! We had lots of fun investigating and discovering lots of cause and effect activities. These included what music we turn on when we place our hands under coloured lights, how to get a ball move through a track using different pipes and mechanisms, how to make a beach ball float in the air, how to make a disc stay spinning on a turn table and which taps to turn on to guide a boat through the stream.

We have also been welcoming a new pupil who had been visiting Kingfisher class this term and we are looking forward to having them join us in the class after half term.















Sparrow Swimming Sessions

Most of us in 1B go swimming with Katie every week in our school Hydrotherapy Pool. We are now really familiar with the sessions and really look forward to these times. We get really excited when it is swimming day! We are following the Rockhopper Series: a programme made up of nine awards that introduce learners to the joy of water. The Rockhopper

Series develops water confidence and swimming skills, as well as increasing water safety awareness. All of us are making really good progress and have achieved award one, with some of us achieving award 2.

Some of our young people took part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch. We sat really quietly watching our wildlife and making a tally of our birds. We will be looking at ways of getting more birds into our garden next year!

Through our school's personal approach each student will discover their own strengths and preferences in the world of work, volunteering and community.

Discovery & Determination

We deliver Careers and Work Related Learning across all of our 3 pathways, Nurture, Life Skill & Work Experience & Academic. Our aims are:

Nurture & Engagement- Through an individual approach and working as a team our curriculum focuses on the development of communication, social & emotional, physical development and contributing to the wider community





The Practical and Life Skills – To participate as an individual or group on work related skills & to engage with practical skills that are needed in adult life that enable individual access to social, cultural and leisure activities.

Work Experience and Academic -To participate as a group on life skills required for independent living and work related skills. Students experience a range of internal and external work placements.







Each of our students from year 7 to year 14 will have a work related and career plan for their year group. These plans are designed to be progressive and bridge the gap between education, independence and supported employment.

Our career programme provides

Multiple opportunities to get to know the world of work, understand what work is, explore their options and build on real experiences and Employer encounters annually for every year group

Every plan is available in adult and student's accessible versions on our website.
