We discussed what role bakers, nurses, gardeners, vets, bus drivers, barbers and other workers play in our lives. We particularly focused on jobs of farmers and refuse collectors. Linnet students watched videos of farmer Amy talking about her work with animals on a farm. We discussed what skills are needed to be a farmer. Linnet students were very involved when we were discussing the importance of the refuse collector's job. Students were engaged and showed good understanding of the topic. We have produced some beautiful pictures and colourings of different jobs that people do. We made a lovely picture display in our class.



As part of our careers, we have learned a range of life skills including washing up, sweeping floors, cleaning tables etc.






