
- A pupil from Hatchling class is taking part in virtual sessions every day (even his baby sister wants to attend!)





Linnet Class


More Highlights from Around the School & At Home (more later in newsletter)

Olivia came to look but didn't want to be on the screen but she was in the background whilst mum stayed on the call.




Migin

More Highlights from Around the School & At Home


- A pupil in Heron Class has made excellent progress with reading comprehension up 2 levels since January!


In the afternoon they have started to learn a new skill. We have skills ranging from learning how to play an instrument, drawing, learning about the RNLI and knitting.





Remote Learning

Our students at home have been keeping busy doing all sorts of educational things!



We have joined the rest of the school in making poppies on a production line in class. It has been great fun although it was a bit tricky, but worth it!










Everyday throughout this term our friends learning at home have joined us for lessons online. We have had lots of fun learning together and learnt to be patient with the internet !



Hatchlings Class have enjoyed walking in the local community. Of course no walk is complete without jumping in a puddle!









STARLING CLASS



Family Support

At The Avenue we aim to offer our families support to enable children to thrive, to maximise potential and independence. We work in close partnership with families, providing care and support to enable everyone to feel confident and secure.

Our Family Support Worker, Kelly Boahene, is integral to achieving these aims. Along with all staff that have contact with your child she endeavours to work with parents and carers to have a positive impact on the lives of children, young people and our families. She offers 1:1 appointments, telephone advice, home visits, support with community appointments, meetings with professionals, as well attending multi-agency meetings in school. She is also available to offer direct support with referrals to various agencies – grant and allowance applications and help with form filling.

As the family support worker Kelly will offer practical help and emotional support to families experiencing short or long-term difficulties, with the aim of empowering parents to address difficult situations, wide-ranging challenges, reduce problems and risks with a range of social and personal issues. If direct support isn't sufficient she will signpost parents and carers to the appropriate agency or professional for advice and action. Family support is also offered for EWO (Education Welfare Officer) home visits, medical appointments, new pupil transitions, and bridging the gap when relationships have broken down.

Throughout the year, in discussion with parents and carers, we look to identify training opportunities and workshops for our parents; these are hopefully useful, interesting and fun. Kelly will liaise with the appropriate professionals and arrange for them to deliver to our parents in school. She will send flyers home, so please look out for these.

Kelly's work with parents is confidential and she works tirelessly to build a trusting relationship with all parents and carers.

This made the product more appealing and up until the last 20 bars we only sold via an ordering system. **Vitally** each student has gained experience of the work place in all aspects of production, quality control, fulfillment and customer service, during this first phase.





The Thoughtful Bubble Company took 3rd place in the National Tycoon Competition with sales of over £700.00!!!



Our aim is to continue trading throughout 2021, with new and exciting products to be made & sold by students, at craft fayres, online and



within our local community. Our profits will be reinvested into the further development of our brand, that will give the opportunity to many more students gaining the experience of the work place in a way that is accessible and meaningful.

Our short term plans are to expand into other products whilst keeping true to our brand (eco-friendly, natural products, vegan, recyclable packaging, made by students) our next products will be centred around Valentine and Mother's day.

Our long-term aim is to register as a charitable business that offers supported volunteering & employment opportunities to SEND adults that have left full time education
